




Asian Film Academy, an educational program of the Busan International Film Festival, was launched in 2005 and designed to discover the emerging generation of Asian filmmakers to catalyze diverse networks among young talents. Asian Film Academy, which has accumulated 407 alumni from 35 countries including the fellows of the last year's edition, has been well received by participants as a global educational program to learn the practice and philosophy of filmmaking under the guidance of world-renowned directors and instructors. Its alumni have been recognized for their excellence in the film industry around the world and at the world's prestigious film festivals.

With the support of Chanel, CHANEL X BIFF Asian Film Academy has a solid foundation and the driving force for educating young, promising Asian talents

in a broader and more innovative way. It plans to actively support fellows to explore various careers and continue networking even after graduating from the academy. CHANEL X BIFF Asian Film Academy seeks to be the most enterprising and essential film education program in Asia.

CHANEL X BIFF Asian Film Academy 2024 explores individual creativity expecting higher project quality through increase in numbers of productions and enhanced curriculum. Departing from the original format where 24 filmmakers collaborated on two short films, eight short films will be created. This innovative approach is expected for each director to explore their artistic voice while maintaining high production quality.

Director / China


Zhang Lu is an ethnic Korean born in Yanbian. His first short film Eleven (2000) was invited to the Venice International Film Festival and gained acclaim for this achievement. His feature debut, Tang Poetry (2003) was invited to film festivals such as Locarno International Film Festival and Vancouver International Film Festival. Grain in Ear (2005) was the winner of New Currents Award at Busan International Film Festival and ACID Award at Cannes Critics' Week, and Desert Dream (2007) which was nominated for the Golden Bear award at Berlin International Film Festival. Afterwards, he directed the film series Chongging (2007) and Iri (2008), set in two cities of Korea and China. Zhang has continued his career with the films including Dooman River (2009) which is the winner of NETPAC Award at the Busan International Film Festival 2010, Gyeongiu (2014), A Quiet Dream (2016), and Fukuoka (2019). Notably, A Quiet Dream was screened as the opening film of the Busan International Film Festival 2016. His latest film The Shadowless Tower (2023) was featured in the competition section of Berlin International Film Festival, and received five awards including Best Artistic Contribution and Best Screenplay at the Beijing International Film Festival. In addition, he served as a professor at Yonsei University from 2012 for about 8 years fostering new talents.

She made a feature debut titled *The Mirror Never Lies* (2011) and her second film *The Seen and Unseen* (2017) won the International Grand Prix for Best Feature Film at Berlinale's Generation Kplus in 2018.

Her last two films *Yuni* (2021) won the Platform Prize at Toronto International Film Festival, and *Before, Now & Then* (2022) won the Silver Bear award for Best Supporting Actress at Berlin International Film Festival. She released Indonesia's first Netflix original series *Cigarette Girl* (2023), following her passion and intention to create more female perspective modern-local stories for a global audience.




Cinematography Mentor URATA Hideho

Urata Hideho is a cinematographer based in Singapore, originally from Japan. He embarked on his career in the United States, where he honed his skills and artistic vision. Urata has garnered widespread recognition for his exceptional talent, notably through his work on acclaimed films such as *A Land Imagined* (2018), which earned the prestigious Golden Leopard at the Locarno International Film Festival. His mastery behind the lens has been lauded with awards such as Best Director of Photography at Valladolid International Film Festival and Achievement in Cinematography at Asia Pacific Screen Awards. In recent times, Urata's significant contributions to cinema, exemplified in films like *Plan 75* (2022), have received acclaim, including a Special Mention at Cannes Film Festival and a nomination for Best Cinematography at the Asian Film Awards in 2023. Noteworthy recent projects encompass *Last Shadow at First Light* (2023), *A Girl Named Ann* (2024), *The Box Man* (2024), and *Stranger Eyes* (2024). In addition to his cinematic endeavors, Urata has served as a distinguished senior lecturer in Film at the University of the Arts Singapore since 2011, further enriching the next generation of filmmakers with his expertise and passion.

Schuyler Weiss is an Academy Award nominated producer based in the Gold Coast, Australia and New York. He has worked with Baz Luhrmann's production company, Bazmark, since 2005 and currently serves as Managing Director and producing partner to Luhrmann and his creative partner Catherine Martin. In addition to producing Luhrmann's latest epic feature *Elvis*, which recently garnered eight Academy Award nominations, including Best Picture, Weiss also executive produced the long-anticipated re-mounting of Luhrmann's *Australia* as a limited series for Hulu and Disney+, titled *Faraway Downs*.

Outside of his work at Bazmark, Weiss is currently producing the feature film *How To Make Gravy*, based on Paul Kelly's iconic song.

In the US, Weiss co-founded New York-based Tandem Pictures in 2010, which he built into a successful film and commercial production company and sold in 2016. He has produced numerous independent films, including three features selected for the Sundance Film Festival.

Weiss's work in entertainment spans film, TV, commercials, live events, VR and even cowriting a song with Elton John.



Moreover, two fellows who are selected as winners of the Pitch Competition, have opportunities to participate in film events in the US and Australia respectively.




Graduation Ceremony & Short Film Screening
